The weather is now warming up and summer days are fast approaching, but there is still lots of work ahead in Ottawa. It's an honour to continue to represent one of the fastest growing communities in the country.

I am also pleased to champion and sponsor petition e-798. This petition calls upon the Canadian government to continue its efforts as key actors in the global effort to eradicate Polio. Polio once affected 40 children every hour, but now less than 40 people were affected by this disease in all of 2016. Even with less and 40 affected by the disease in 2016 an outbreak could still happen if we do not continue our efforts. This petition is part of the One Last Push Campaign that seeks to fully eradicate Polio and ensure that no one will ever have to suffer from this terrible disease. Bicycle Helmet Safety



Head injuries are a leading cause of serious injury and death to children riding bicycles*. Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. Remember - it's the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

Getting informed

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent a serious injury, or even save a life;
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death;
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet;
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged.

Getting started

- Allow children to assist when buying their helmet. Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them;
- Start the habit early. Young

Getting the right fit

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash;
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead;
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To test the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the straps are unfastened;
- Adjust the chin straps to form a "Y" below and slightly forward from the ears;
- Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it is fastened;
- children learning to ride tricycles need to wear helmets;
- Parents must lead by example always wear a helmet when cycling.
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort and safety.

Terwillegar Riverbend Advisory Council (TRAC) Update

Have you ever wondered what TRAC is? It is the acronym for 'Terwillegar Riverbend Advisory Council'.

It all began April 27, 2002 City of Edmonton, Community Services organized a meeting at the Solicitor General's College in an attempt to bring together the Community Leagues and Home Owners Associations of the area. Out of this meeting, the concept of a president's council, like the one in Millwoods was born. The group decided to meet again with the intent of creating such a council.

A number of meetings followed with is a society being formed under the Alberta Societies Act on December 1, 2003 under the direction of the 3 active community leagues in the Terwillegar/Riverbend area at that time: Riverbend, Brookview, & The Ridge.

Each of Terwillegar Riverbend's 18 neighbourhoods, plus outlying areas of Windermere are represented by а "Community Ambassador". The neighbourhoods consist of: Brander Gardens, Brookside, Ramsay Heights, Rhatigan Ridge, Bulyea Heights, Carter Crest, Leger, Ogilvie Ridge, Haddow, Henderson Estates, Falconer Heights, Magrath, Mactaggart, South Terwillegar, Terwillegar Towne, Terwillegar Gardens, Hodgson, & Greater Windermere.

The Executive Board consists of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, TRAC Community Advocate and Past-President.

Anyone is free to attend the TRAC Meetings, but only members have voting rights.





Transfer of Drainage Services to EPCOR Utilities

On April 12, City Council voted to transfer drainage services to EPCOR Utilities. I voted in favour of the move, which will give EPCOR control of the

City's drainage infrastructure starting September 1, 2017. Many citizens may not realize EPCOR is owned by the City of Edmonton, which means Council will still oversee and regulate drainage projects.

This decision came after many months of debate. In June 2016, the City first heard EPCOR's proposal to transfer the City's drainage assets and operation. The City hired Grant Thornton LLP to do an independent study of EPCOR's proposal. Released in November 2016, the report concluded that ECPOR's proposal had merit.

EPCOR currently operates the City's three other utilities: power distribution, drinking water treatment and wastewater management. With this transfer, EPCOR will consolidate all of Edmonton's water utility operations, which has the potential to create efficiencies and lead to an increased dividend for the City.

City Council will still have oversight and ownership of drainage assets. As EPCOR's only shareholder, the City of Edmonton will continue to regulate drainage projects, and drainage utility rates will continue to be set by Council's utility committee.

I believe this move will have many benefits for the City and residents. EPCOR brings flexibility and experience that will help them deliver on major drainage projects in a costeffective manner. The public's interest has always been a top priority throughout this process, and I believe residents will not experience a decrease in drainage services.



Weekly recipes have Nutrition Tips, Sprouting Chef's Tips that explain very basic cooking concepts to children who are just starting out their adventures in the kitchen, and Creative Cook's Tips that teach children to swap ingredients, experiment with some of the weird and wonderful fruits and veggies found at a farmers' market, or step up the complexity of a recipe. In this way, the recipes make nutritional learning fun and accessible to all children, no matter what their interest or ability level.

try to raise your children in nutritionally mindful ways! It provides opportunities for your children to learn to cook and to talk to other adults about their food and the choices they are making. In short, it reinforces the lessons that you are trying to impart to help them live healthy lives. Our hope is that Sprouts goes a long way toward making cooking at home a fun adventure

Renovations That Sell - Get The Best Bang For Your Buck!

This is the busy time of year in real estate. Many people think about moving in the spring and most need to sell their current homes first. If you've thought about selling and buying, you've probably looked at your own home and wondered about how it might sell in today's market. If you look around and see a pristine, show home-quality masterpiece then there's nothing to worry about (except a possible If, however, OCD diagnosis). you see a home that's been mildly traumatized by children, pets and in-laws then you may want to upgrade it in some way before you sell. The trick is to make it quick and cost-effective, so you get the best return on investment (ROI).


The general rule is that you will not get dollar-for-dollar back on renovations. Usually not even close. Buyers typically will not value the work done at retail prices, even if it's new. Sort of like the new car that loses 25% of its value as soon as you leave the lot. Buyers may have wanted a cheaper option or a different style, and the upgrades are always viewed as "used". So spending \$30K on a kitchen that may add \$15K to the sale price is probably not a great option. However, there are some things you can do that will dramatically improve the appearance (and saleability) of your home for relatively little in terms of cost and time. It's like speed dating – you don't need to invest in a PhD, but your odds are better if you've combed your hair and traded your "socks and crocs" look for something a little snazzy.

Paint is the big one. Remember when junior took the sharpie and wrote "daddy smells funny" on the wall? Well now's a good time to cover that up. But the obvious holes and dents should be filled first, so don't forget to tackle that spackle! With some planning and learning (hooray for Youtube) most people can do all of this themselves. For a couple hundred dollars and a few days' work, most homes can be transformed from dreary to dreamy. Even if you pay a company to do it, painting is the one thing you can do that can actually make you money (the ROI can be over 100%). And it's quick.

Makeup is good but sometimes you need a little Clearasil too. You can get a decent ROI from the 3 Fs: floors, fixtures and a "facelift". Going from badly-stained pink carpet to hardwood or a decent laminate is a more expensive investment but it can be worth it. Although the ROI is in the 50-75% range, it will make your home look far more appealing to far more buyers. Fixtures are the same. Changing lights and switches (when combined with painting) can make the upgrades look more "thorough". And a facelift is good if you have the time. This just refers to re-surfacing cabinets and counters (only if needed) and even something like changing the front door. Just make sure you pick cost-effective options ("imported Italian marble" looks great in a write up but you won't get your money back.)

Landscaping is the other great option. You don't need to add a 6-tier deck, a heart-shaped hot tub or anything fancy. Just make the yard look clean and tidy. Maybe fix the gate, stain the deck and pick up the winter doggie-bombs. Get some friends and family, a few adult beverages and spend a sunny day cleaning it all up. You hear people talk about "curb appeal" and "first impressions", well landscaping is a big part of that.

There are two important caveats. The first is that buyers want to assume that the building envelope/ functional parts are all in proper working order. If you have a leaky roof or a dead furnace, you should fix those first. The other caveat is that you should choose modern colours and fixtures that have wide appeal. You may love that eggplant carpet on sale at Home Depot but most people won't. They really won't. Visit some show homes to get some ideas for colours and designs. Then come up with a plan and a budget. Most of these little things will not add dollar for dollar, but they will help your home sell faster for a better price.






