TRAC continues to excite the community! High attendance at the last two meetings (Dec. 10 & Jan. 14) is proof. Here is a summary:

Financial

TRAC is a non-profit organization that does not charge for membership and relies on monetary donations and business sponsorship.

We would like to thank the Brookview Homeowners Association (BCAL) for a donation of \$500.

We would also like to thank Jim Hillman and Snow Valley Ski Hill for the ongoing donation of meeting space and refreshments for our meetings. Money raised for the Rec Centre has been placed in trust with the City of Edmonton.

Quesnell Bridge Project

The bridge widening is expected to be complete by the end of 2010; the scope of the project includes the widening of the Whitemud to six continuous lanes and road re-surfacing between 149 St. and 170 St.

Several preparatory phases will take place prior to all of this, which will be detailed at open houses planned for Feb. 12 and 13. See the complete TRAC Transportation Update and please plan to attend the open houses.

Public Education Priorities

Catherine Ripley, Edmonton Public School trustee for our ward, asked for input on what the district priorities should be for 2008-2011.

The priorities set the stage for all planning and budgeting decisions across the district for the next three years, so this a fundamentally important decision.

Plans for Quesnell Bridge underway

Suggested priorities from around the table included: Encouraging girls to take a technical path, pursuing increased funding, placing more focus on second languages, working with immigrants and refugee families more effectively, emphasizing technology to ensure student competiveness in a global marketplace, increasing accessibility to facilities, looking at how special needs children are accommodated, carrying on with school closures so educational services can be better distributed to all areas of the city (including the suburbs), and continuing to reduce class sizes.

Security

Superintendent Nigel Stevens provided a report on activity in the TRAC area and reminded everyone not to leave valuables within sight in their cars.

It was also noted that the greatest risk the TRAC community faces is traffic collision due to speeding and tailgating. We all need to slow down and take our time!

Terwillegar Park

The Terwillegar Park Advisory Committee discussed the pros and cons of four options for the development of the park. The planning team is now working on two options to present to council and the public. These will be available for presentation in February.

The park enhancement concept (two to four years away) was approved, and then budgeted for. Rabbit Hill Road from Promontory Point to Terwillegar Park will be paved and the parking lot expanded. There will be a commuter trail but the park will be kept as is with some improvement.

Southwest Recreation Centre

Joe Yurkovich and Tim Cartmell, on behalf of TRAC, spoke at city council regarding the SCRC on Dec.18 at which time council approved the

project to go on to detailed negotiations. A special thanks to the TRAC Recreation and Design Committee for the time spent on this colossal project.

EFCL

Harold Hornig, our Area H Rep, along with Alan Bolstad, Executive Director of the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL), presented the EFCL budget to council.

After much discussion, city council made a motion to accept all funds requested by the EFCL. The EFCL has taken a stand on issues and supported diverse community concerns - from First Time Home Buyer's Program to oil wells near new developments.

Harold also represents the EFCL on the EPCOR public advisory council and as such, has had input on upcoming bylaws related to water quality and low flush toilets.

Looking ahead at area transportation plans

TRAC Transportation

It is said that Edmonton has but two seasons: winter and construction.

Since it is winter, we will look forward to the next - season and onward.

23rd Ave. across Smith Crossing and 119th St.

In 2008, the bridge across Smith Crossing will be completed along with two more lanes on 23rd Ave. from Rabbit Hill Road to 119th St. Parking facilities will be built to access Whitemud Creek Ravine. Work will be finalized on 119th St. and four lanes will be opened. The completion date for the project is fall 2008.

23rd Ave. at Calgary Trail

In the year ahead, construction will focus on preparatory work for the interchange. Look for fills for ramps and retaining walls and pilings for bridges. The bridges and decks are scheduled for 2009 with completion of all five bridges in 2010. Repair work is all that remains for 2011 with a new barrier on Calgary Trail.

The city has decided to drop the BRT acronym and replace it with TPC (Transit Priority Corridors) because these routes will focus on express buses with fewer stops. The decision has been made, at least at this time, to keep all lanes open to traffic. The current TPC under review is from Lewis Estates past West Edmonton Mall and using Stony Plain Road to Downtown. Stony Plain Road will no longer be reduced to two lanes of traffic as was previously proposed.

The LRT along with the bus overpass at Belgravia Road will be complete to University South Campus in January of 2009 and to Century Park by 2010. For this reason, the city is preparing for the next route. Three routes have been designed with the west route remaining to be chosen. Here are the options:

Downtown - to NAIT Northeast – past Clareview South – beyond Century Park The city is looking for your input on a web survey called Beyond Century Park.

Pedestrian Bridge over the Whitemud at 142 St.

This project has been delayed to coincide with Phase 2, the construction of the Whitemud/ Terwillegar interchange. The city looked at all options for relocation of the bridge and after lengthy consultation with stakeholders finally determined that the original location remains the best alternative.

Quesnell Bridge

This year, the permanent barrier in the median will be removed, filled with asphalt, and temporary barriers placed. There may be some lane closures for brief periods of time, mostly on weekends and non-peak hours. This change will facilitate moving lanes during construction. In 2009 and 2010, the bridge will be widened. Like in 2008, the city will be negotiating with the contractor to determine the length of time that lanes are closed. Two options are under consideration: five lanes open to traffic but closing the pedestrian bridge, or four lanes of traffic and keeping

High Speed Transit (HST) the pedestrian bridge open. Rabbit Hill Road to connect to Anthon y Henday in 2008 Road north of Anthony Henday within the next

Residents in Riverbend-Terwillegar will soon have another access to Anthony Henday this year.

Road work began in 2007 for a Rabbit Hill Road and Anthony Henday right-in/right-out connection and is expected to be completed by this fall, says Brian Latte, director of development and capital planning with the City of Edmonton's Transportation Planning Branch.

"That means for Terwillegar residents, they can come from Hwy. 2, travel west on Anthony Henday and make a right turn at Rabbit Hill Road north into Terwillegar. Similarly, traffic

existing from Terwillegar can turn onto the ramp to continue west on Anthony Henday across the river. The remaining turn movements will not be available until the province completes the Rabbit Hill Road bridge across Anthony Henday, currently planned for 2011," he said.

The city anticipates traffic volume around 23rd Ave. and Rabbit Hill Road will decrease once this connection is open while traffic volume at the south end of Rabbit Hill Road will rise.

"We expect that the average volume will be in the 5,000 to 10,000 verhicle per day range depending on the specific point along Rabbit Hill Road," said Latte.


The city is not planning to widen Rabbit Hill

five years.

"Widening will take place as traffic volumes increase. Typically, arterialroadways such as Rabbit Hill Road are widened from two lanes to four lanes when traffic volumes exceed 15,000 vehicles per day. Widening of Rabbit Hill Road north of 23rd Ave. is warranted and the transportation department will be considering this section of road in the development of our 2009-2011 capital construction program," explained Latte.

The developers in Terwillegar and Windemere are sharing the \$5 million project costs for the connection of Rabbit Hill Road to the Henday.

Route 37 to extend to South Terwillegar this year



South Terwillegar residents will no longer have to walk to Towne Centre Blvd. to catch a bus if plans for extending Route 37 go ahead this spring.

Chuck Van Deel Piepers, assistant director of service development, said the route will be extended into South Terwillegar once street lighting is installed.

"We are working towards implementation in spring 2008," he said.

Route 37 will operate in a clockwise loop along Terwillegar Blvd., Rabbit Hill Road, South Terwillegar Dr., Towne Centre Blvd., and then back to Terwillegar Blvd. The bus will also head to the Hertitage Transit Centre. It will operate during peak hours on weekdays. "Service during other time periods would be provided in the future based on the progress of the development in the area, ridership on route during peak hours and funding approval," said Van Deel Piepers.



Iveson eyes future in transit

Almost every conversation I had in Terwillegar during the last election included transportation. While we have much work to do city-wide, there is light at the end of the tunnel.

Work continues on Smith Crossing, which is on schedule for a fall 2008 opening. Needed widening of Rabbit Hill Road in front of Riverbend Square to four lanes is also in the budget for this coming year, though it hasn't been tendered yet.

Plans and funding are also in place to deliver better transit to the Terwillegar area as well. The Leger Transit Centre is going to tender shortly, and is intended to open at the same time as the South Campus LRT station, at which time bus routes and schedules will be adjusted.

This ought to make transit more relevant to some residents, but we have long road ahead to ensure that transit becomes a preferred choice for more Edmontonians.

I have a particular interest in ensuring that transit works better throughout Terwillegar-Riverbend, since there is demand for it among many residents I spoke to - more than I was expecting.

I hear widespread recognition of the environmental benefits of transit, and a desire on the part of residents to reduce the emissions associated with their travel, which transit can do by up to 80 per cent over single-occupant vehicles.


Furthermore, practically speaking, we are not likely to be able to accommodate all the impacts of explosive population growth in the southwest with road widenings alone.

So it is for both practical and environmental reasons, more of us ought to use public transit over time. Of course it will be a gradual shift, and I recognize that it's a shift that's only likely to occur if the city delivers significantly improved service.

Further LRT expansion to Century Park and, hopefully, onward will help by speeding up travel times and creating more points for buses to link into the light rail network.

Realistically speaking, we won't be able to make buses work for everyone, so part of expanding people's transportation options will include delivering a park and ride option - ideally near Anthony Henday Drive. Plans are being considered now and funding will need to be in place before that can proceed, but it's a key piece of the puzzle.



It is God's creation and even though we release all kind of goop and grime into the system, the planet continues to recreate
