


we want to hear about.


2. The month of May actually holds a lot of significance to Star Wars fans. All six of the live action films have debuted in May, with the first movie hitting

Spring Has Sprung!

Here comes the soccer season!

Is your child a soccer player? Does he or she experience occasional knee pain or do they walk or run slightly knock kneed as they are growing?

Knee injuries are common in all athletes, but soccer players are especially prone to knee injuries such as serious ACL ligament tears. This is especially true in female soccer players. Studies have shown that the female soccer players risk of sustaining an ACL injury is two to eight times greater than that of her male counterpart. Subsequent studies have shown that adding neuromuscular and proprioceptive exercises (aka balance training) to the training regimen can reduce the number of ACL injuries by two to four fold.

Increased 'Q angle' (angle from the front of the hip to the

centre of knee cap) is greater in females, and this is the reason for greater risk for ACL injuries. Early assessment and proper training is the key...

Physiotherapists can treat any knee injury, as well as give you a proper strengthening

and proprioception (balance) program to help prevent serious knee injuries. If you have a problem with your knee, have a daughter who plays soccer, or are a volunteer coach with a young girls team, there is no better time to learn proper knee strengthening. Start

proper training now and give your child an early advantage through their sporting life!

Have you heard about the TRAC Alerts Messaging System?

Whether it's crime related activities or whether its items of great interest to the community, this is the email group that you need to part of!

It's easy to sign up – just go to www.tracspirit.ca, click on "Alerts Messaging System". Once registered, you will receive a confirmation email.

The Alerts Messaging System is a part of a network of email groups in the Terwillegar/Riverbend/Windermere area that reach over 1700 residents, announcing community events

and bringing crime alerts and updates to the attention of all of us! This significantly improves our awareness and our sense of community and with the help of Sgt. Larry Langley of the EPS, we are able to utilize this network to reduce crime and bring justice to those that choose to do harm to our area.

Crime and Crime Statistics in the Riverbend Area A few years ago, the Edmonton Police Services introduced a web based crime mapping program. You can link to it from our TRAC webpage at the right menu panel.

Although there has been a greater

police presence in our area, we have to rely upon residents in the Riverbend/Terwillegar/Windermere communities to take some simple and straight forward steps to reduce the opportunity for crime to occur.

A few basic rules include:

- Do not leave valuables in your parked vehicle.
- Do not leave an extra set of keys in your vehicle.
- If you leave your vehicle parked outside overnight, remove the garage door opener. There have been occurrences where vehicles are broken into and then the garage door opener is used

to access the attached garage.

- Do not leave your garage door open overnight.
- If you see suspicious persons or suspicious activity in the area, please give police a call.

National Paramedic Services Week

National Paramedic Services Week is May 27 – June 2, 2018

National Paramedic Services Week honours the paramedic profession and recognizes the men and women of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) providing this key public service. It is also an opportunity for the public to better understand the important role EMS has within both the health care system and our communities.

The year's national theme is, *Paramedics: Health. Community. You.*

Whether directly, or indirectly, every Albertan has felt the importance of the service paramedics provide. Paramedics are trained health care professionals who stabilize and treat patients before and during transport to hospital. In some areas of the province, paramedics are now working side-by-side their health care colleagues in hospitals and community care facilities.

- There are over 4,000 EMS practitioners and 550 ambulances in the Alberta Health Services system province-wide;
- Approximately 5,500 patients will be transferred by fixed wing aircraft through contracted air ambulance providers in Alberta this year;
- EMS dispatch receives over 500,000 ground ambulance calls each year.

EMS practitioners across the Alberta and Canada will be celebrating National Paramedic Services Week in a variety of ways. If you have any suggestions regarding new programming or how to improve our existing



Update on the Terwillegar Corridor - The Time is Now

Our office has been very busy since the start of 2018 dealing with reaction to conceptual drawings presented by City Administration for Terwillegar Drive.

Understandably so, many residents were frustrated to see a rehashing of design plans that had already been decided on in previous consultations in 2001, 2006, and 2012.

After listening to feedback from hundreds of residents, I decided to put forward a motion to City Council to ensure we see action, not redundancy, for the Terwillegar Corridor.

I'm pleased to say that on February 28, 2018, Council voted unanimously in favour of it.

My motion reads as follows:

That Administration do the following:

Suspend any public engagement activities regarding the ultimate long term Terwillegar Drive / Whitemud Drive interchange and any roadway modifications that may limit access in the interim;

Optimize the concept plan for the Terwillegar corridor between Whitemud Drive and Anthony Henday Drive, including provision for opportunities of mass transit and active transportation;

Advance the Preliminary Design for Terwillegar Drive /40th Avenue interchange;

Advance the Preliminary Design for an optimized Stage 2 of the Whitemud Drive / Terwillegar Drive interchange, with consideration for reduced design parameters (i.e. design speeds) with the intent of reducing overall complexity and cost;

Continue to advance preliminary design on the basis of a number of \$75-100M packages in support of staged completion of the Terwillegar corridor, including full access for 40th Avenue, Rabbit Hill Road, 23 Avenue, and Haddow Drive;

Present a list of potential shared funding opportunities with the provincial and federal government that take advantage of infrastructure and innovation funding;

Bring back to Council a report summarizing progress on the aforementioned design elements in 2018 Q3.

So, what are the next steps?

The next consultation on Terwillegar Drive will primarily focus on the 40th avenue interchange (with full access), and will take place either in late June or early September. I will post information on my

website as it becomes available.

Following that consultation, cost and schedule information will be discussed and debated as the Capital Plan for the next four year cycle is decided this fall. I will be strongly advocating for multiple \$75-\$100 packages of staged completion of the Terwillegar corridor to be included in that Capital Plan.

If passed in the Capital Plan, design of those segments would take approximately one year, with construction ideally starting in 2020, and completion likely in 2022.

In the longer term, I will be advocating for the rest of the Terwillegar Corridor upgrades to be a part of the 10 year transportation master plan so that we can see completion in the next decade of this necessary work for our communities.

Thank you to the over 2,600 at print time residents who signed my call to action in support of the motion. I have heard your message loud and clear, and will continue to be a strong advocate for your thoughts on this topic.

Esther Starkman Pre-enrolment for 2018-19

Public Service Announcement

For the 2018-2019 year Esther Starkman will have all grades, from Kindergarten to 9.

The following process will guide pre-enrolment at Esther Starkman School:

New Students living in Terwillegar Towne:

- Terwillegar Towne is the primary attendance area for Esther Starkman school.
- All students who live within the primary attendance area will be accepted regardless of the grade they are entering if they can provide proof of residency. Examples of proof of residency are: Bill of sale for your house, utility bill with name and address, rental agreement with name and address.
- New kindergarten registrations will be accepted at Esther Starkman until April 16, 2018.

To apply you will need to bring proof of residence and proof of age. Please come to the school to fill in the application.

New Students living in Terwillegar South West and Elsewhere:

- Esther Starkman School has an optimal enrolment limit of 950 students.
- All enrolment decisions regarding students from outside of our primary attendance area will be made with this number in mind.
- Space availability will be determined on a grade by grade basis. For example, space may be available in kindergarten but not in grade 5.
- South Terwillegar West will be the secondary attendance area for Esther Starkman School. Students living in this attendance area will be accepted as space permits..

•Available space will be determined on April 16th after accommodating all kindergarten students from our primary attendance area (Terwillegar Towne).

Students living in Terwillegar Southwest will then be given priority. If there are still available spots, then we will be accepting students from outside of our primary and secondary attendance boundaries.

•If more applications from outside our primary attendance area are received than we have space to accommodate, all secondary applications will be sent downtown and a random selection draw will be conducted by the district on April 25th.

•Random selection draws will be conducted on a grade by grade basis to fill available space. •Students who are successful in the random selection draw will be enrolled at Esther Starkman. Students who are unsuccessful will have their applications forwarded to Lansdowne School. •Once a student is accepted into Esther Starkman they will be able to attend through Grade 9 without having to go through random selection again.





Bicycle Helmet Safety



Head injuries are the leading cause of serious injury and death to kids on wheels*. Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. Remember – it's the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

Getting informed

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent a serious injury, or even save a life;
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death;
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet;
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged.

Getting started

- Allow children to assist when buying their helmet. Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them;
- Start the habit early. Young children learning to ride tricycles need to wear helmets;
- Parents must lead by example – always wear a helmet when cycling.

Getting the right fit

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash;
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead;
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To test the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the straps are unfastened;
- Adjust the chin straps to form a “Y” below and slightly forward from the ears;
- Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it is fastened;
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort and safety.

Mechanized River Valley Access The 100 Street Funicular

*Public Service
Announcement*

The Mechanized River Valley Access project makes the river valley more accessible to people of all ages and abilities. It runs from the top of 100 Street near the Hotel Macdonald to the river valley trail system near the low level bridge.

The Promontory (Top Platform)
The platform allows users to take advantage of the amazing views from the top of the bank near the Hotel Macdonald.

The Stairs
A place to linger, to stop and sit, or to get in your daily workout. There is a bike rail for cyclists that runs the length of the stairs.

The 100 Street Funicular
With plenty of space for wheelchairs, walkers, strollers, and bikes, the glass-enclosed funicular descends from

the top of the bank to the promenade above the valley floor. It fits up to 20 people.

The Promenade
It includes a grassy seating area with benches and an art piece called Turbulent inspired by the unique water patterns of the North Saskatchewan River and created by Jill Anhold, based in Vancouver.

The Bridge
Connecting the promenade to the lookout, the bridge provides safe


passage across Grierson Hill Road.

The Frederick G. Todd Lookout
A glass railing and built-in seating allows a seamless way to take in the flow of the river and the downtown skyline.

The Elevator
From the bridge, an elevator and a staircase will connect the Mechanized River Valley Access to the existing trail system and Louise McKinney Park, the Low Level Bridge,

and the Rossdale/River Crossing area. It holds up to 10 people.

Mechanized access will create a new destination in our city: an innovative, barrier-free system that will allow people to enjoy both our vibrant downtown and our amazing river valley within minutes. The elevator will be open during regular park hours (7 am to 9 pm). The stairs will be open from 5 am to 11 pm (weather permitting).
